### Health Information Security and Privacy

Seems most information you need these days is available electronically. What if your medical records were also available electronically? The Federal government has set a goal for most Americans to have Electronic Health Records by 2014. What is an Electronic Health Record (EHR)? It is a computerized version of your medical data. By using an EHR, your medical information is electronically stored and can be shared by physicians treating you. A physician can instantly see your medical history including test results, allergies, and medications so time is saved in an emergency, as well as money, by not repeating costly medical tests. Some of the other benefits of EHRs include providing greater security and privacy than paper records.
